# Approval of Per Diem and Travel Reimbursement Policy for Trustees and Staff

#### Other

Illinois Department of Insurance – The Executive Director distributed a publication from the Illinois Department of Insurance, which outlines the annual earnings, salary or wages maximum for the Fund's Tier II employees for 2016, as well as the unadjusted change in the CPI-U, which is used to calculate the annual increase in pensions. He noted that this information would be forwarded to the appropriate Chicago Park District staff. He also noted that he and Fund Counsel would develop a letter to be sent on or around December 1 advising the annuitants of the calculation and of the lawsuit, which challenges the constitutionality of Public Act 098-0622.

Senate Hearings - The Executive Director reported that he and the Fund's investment consultant, Marquette Associates, Inc., presented a report to the Illinois State Senate Committee on Public Pensions Investments annual Subject Matter Hearing on MWBE Investments on Wednesday, November 18. The Executive Director and the Trustees discussed the importance of continuing to support minority and women owned investment managers, brokers, and businesses.

Annual Budget – The Executive Director reported that he and the Fund's Comptroller would present the Fund's 2016 annual budget at the December Board meeting.

Disaster Recovery Plan - The Executive Director reported that he and the Fund's IT consultant are in the process of updating the Fund's Disaster Recovery Plan and it will be presented to the Board in the next few months.

Conferences – The Executive Director distributed 2016 Conference Schedules to the Trustees and highlighted upcoming local conferences.

The Executive Director reported that Vice President GERAGHTY, Trustee GIANFORTUNE and the Executive Director have expressed interest in attending OPAL Public Funds Summit, January 13-15, 2016.
